From the President's Desk

Dear Friends,

For nearly three decades, Bharatiya Jain Sangathan (BJS) has borne the responsibility of identifying the areas that plague the society and presenting

For the coming years, our major thrust would be on the theme -"Nayi Peedhi, Nayi Soch".
