For Congenital Facial Deformities (BJS-FPSC)

Why the Free Plastic Surgery camps?

An infant born with facial deformities like Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate, Squint, and scars of different kinds suffers from depression and inferiority complex. Such boys and girls live a life of outcasts. They suffer in their studies and their overall health remains adversely affected. Such children, as they grow into adulthood, find it difficult to get married because of the deformities.

Plastic surgery is the only solution in these cases. Unfortunately, plastic surgeons are few in number and most of them are based in cities.



A lot needs to be done as yet in terms of reaching out to several untapped regions of India where there exists as high a demand for plastic surgery camps to bring about t h e m u c h - n e e d e d rejuvenation in the lives of the economically marginalised.

B h a r a t i y a J a i n Sanghatna(BJS) has therefore taken upon itself the task of finding a suitable partner who will ensure that this unique mission will not fade away into oblivion.

While BJS will continue to provide the same level of support as it has done over the past so many years, it expects the new collaborator to consider following aspects with BJS support.

BJS Support

- · Provision of logistical support for the camps.
- Training of personnel for the smooth management of the camps.
- · Identification of people who need the surgeries.
- Obtaining government clearance for conducting camps at primary health centres.
- Generating resources for distribution of medical supplies and appointment of paramedical staff.
- Creating awareness through publicity mechanisms.

Expected support from well-wishers

- Willingness to take care of the to and fro travel fare of doctors from the US who are ready to come to India for two-week stints and perform the surgeries.
- Alternatively, willingness to cover the expenses on Indian Plastic Surgeons to carry out these surgeries in regions or districts of choice.
- Provide medical supplies required for the patients prior, during and after the surgeries.
- Generate the required funding support to make each of such camps a reality.
