Empowerment of Girls:

This three-day workshop successfully conducted in Jain Community from 2008 has empowered more than 20,000 girls. With the increasing popularity and acceptance of these workshops BJS has decided to conduct it for other communities through tie-ups with schools and educational institutions. Till date more than 100 MOU signed with different schools and 500 workshops have been conducted under the same.

Free plastic surgery camps are conducted in the months of December and January every year. This camp is conducted at Sancheti Hospital in Pune around 7th January every year.

The BJS Career Guidance Program is the appropriate medium to provide the parents and students with ample and useful information of latest courses, higher education options, methods of application and preparation required for various entrance tests. It is two hour session conducted by trained resource persons with the help of state, district or local BJS office bearers. Since 2005 more than 50000 students across eight different states have benefitted from this program.

Student Assessment **Program**:

The current world of technological advancement is fast and places heavy demands on the intellectual ability and emotional stability of human beings. Children being our only and true assets, it is imperative to gauge their strengths and weaknesses at an early age and need to guide them towards their improvement and enhance their skills at all levels.

Student assessment test for class four is available on www.bissap.org. Parents or teachers can assist the student to give the test. It is multidimensional test, the test measures emotional, social, physical and intellectual growth of the student. More details about the test have been provided on the link. The test is divided in different sessions and student can able to give it in one or more attempt. At the end of the test the students receive a printed report so that they can analyze and improve their skills.

Minority:

BJS has published six books on Minority in Hindi and English related to benefits for Business, Students, Educational Institutions, Women,

Religious Establishments and NGO. Apart from this, 'Lectures on Minority f o r C o m m u n i t y Awareness' are being extensively organized by BJS to take the Minority Benefits under different categories to each and every Jain household.

Since January 2015, 53 trainers from 7 states have delivered more than 100 awareness sessions all over India; mainly in Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Karnataka, some part of North East Region and Gujarat. At BJS Minority held desk helpminority@bjsindia.o rg is functional to solve the queries of the community members regarding Minority laws, updates and amendments. The organization also sends across all useful information through Whatsapp to the registered community members on a regular basis.

Being a forerunner in identifying and solving the societal problems, BJS has with its unique methodologies, devised a set of training programs and tours that equip the existing and new entrepreneurs with essential skills and required exposure to establish new businesses and expand the old ones.



Business Development Program (BDP):

This program has been formulated to update the existing entrepreneurs and people running traditional businesses with the current trends and approaches in the global market. Addressed by Business gurus like Shri Rakesh Jain, Shri Chakor Gandhi and many others these seminars promote growth, sustainability, high profits and fewer pitfalls thereby boosting the overall organizational performance. More than 40 BDPs have been conducted so far under the BJS banner.

Igniting Business Development (iBuD):

The iBuD exposure tour has been conceptualized for the young and budding entrepreneurs and also those who want to convert their existing businesses to smart enterprises. The 7day Business Exposure Tour-iBuD (Igniting Business Development) of BJS was conducted across seven cities namely Pune, Mumbai, Jalgaon, Ahmedabad, Indore, Bangalore and Chennai in April, 2015. The second iBuD tour will take the participants across six cities in six days and it will be conducted from September 28-October 3, 2015. The event will flag off from Chennai and the closing ceremony will be held in Pune.

BJS Youth Cell also organizes seminars on Business by eminent speakers and business gurus periodically to apprise the young members of the latest business techniques and motivate them to alleviate the socio-economic status of the nation by diving into entrepreneurship and generating employment for hundreds of other youth too.
