Social Entrepreneurship & Social Contribution

Today, entrepreneurship is about packing new ideas and taking them into new destinations by applying the business principles on revolutionary sectors. Society and its development have to be considered as one such revolutionary sector which is sidelined at times in business growth and economic development. In social sector too there's business but here the business is not just measured on the basis of balance sheet. Its potential for social benefits and impact on the community decides the success. In simple term, it is basically business for social development.

The terminology "social entrepreneurship" conveys a model of identifying public problem and executes business insights to solve those problems. The aim of this social venture is not to give stress on profit but simultaneously & positively impacting on the society for good changes. But this type of entrepreneurship also demands the same motivation, innovation and confidence just like other businesses. The only thing is that priorities are different here.

Some examples of social entrepreneurs will help to understand the concept clearly. One such man is Dr. Verghese Kurien, who is known as the father of the India's milk revolution in India. Under his guidance the cooperative system for milk production was introduced in remote India and the country become the second largest milk producer in the world. Yet another example is of Montessori Schools which are known in every nook and corner of the world. An internationally accepted education model for children and the lady behind is Maria Montessori from Italy who is widely respected as a great educationist but is not know as a successful social entrepreneur. Isn't this an enough dose of social entrepreneurship? How about taking a swift ride on "social contribution" now?

The simple meaning of "social contribution" is to give back to society. A good differentiation between "social contribution" and "social entrepreneurship" is easy to understand. The first thing is that one doesn't need to be an entrepreneur to contribute to the society as per the understanding of "social contribution" or doesn't need to be rich either to work for the people. Every big journey starts with a tiny step. Start feeding one hungry person and inspire other friends to scale up the activity.

In contrary to Social entrepreneurship which is generally a Top Down model, Social contribution is the Bottom Up approach where social work starts from the bottom or common people of the society who start their journey by working for at least one people from his/her own excess resources – whether money, goods or knowledge.

Both the models are helping society and feasible for every individual according to what suits them individually. Let's take a pledge to play our role wherever we see the Men, Women, Children, animals, flora, fauna and our scarce natural resources in danger either because of poverty and hunger, natural calamities or manmade disasters and atrocities! We must not forget that ocean is formed with many drops of water, so at least lets' help each other by contributing even one drop.

Moreover, under the leadership of Pradeep Lokhande, the team works with the village opinion leaders & non-resident villagers for development & networking purpose. Right from keeping an efficient communication with villages till establishing library & computer education facilities in the remote areas, Pradeep Lokhande redefines the concept of new-age social entrepreneurship.
